### Recyclable Household Waste Materials

### Food Bin or Caddy (certain areas only)

If you can eat it or drink it, then it goes in this bin. Raw, cooked or out of date it can go in here. Make sure there is no packaging in with it. No liquid fats or oils please.

#### Waste or Residual bin.

General household waste that doesn't go in the other bins goes in this bin. We cannot take any of the following material. Paints, Paint Cans, Thinners, Asbestos, Clinical Waste, Animal Carcasses, Batteries, Chemical Waste, Creosote, Gas Bottles, Fire Extinguishers, Fluorescent Lights and Bulbs, Waste Oils, Sludges, Contaminated Soil or any material generally considered to be harmful or hazardous.

This is not an exhaustive list so if you are unsure about the suitability of any waste please contact us at the office.

Inclusion of these prohibited materials may result in your waste being rejected and your bin not emptied.

### Glass Bin. (certain areas only)

Ordinary glass jars and bottles of any colour. Please make sure they are empty and rinsed out. No Pyrex, ceramics or window glass. No light bulbs or fluorescents please.
